We have a lottery registration process for members, for long-time camp attendees, and for friends registering for the same camp session.

Spirit in the Pines: Camp Programs

Spirit in the Pines: Weekend Family Camps & Affordable Off-Season Group Options

Description: Summer weekends at camp are reserved for families to rent a cabin together at a low cost. Four meals and optional camp activities are provided. Then from September–May a group or family can reserve a cabin and plan their own DIY experience.


