Childcare

Age Range: 6 weeks-5-year-olds

Milestone Ministries

Passing on the Christian faith from generation to generation is at the heart of the life and the work of the church. Milestone Ministries brings an awareness of the presence of God in our lives and gives us the tools for living our faith in daily life.

Currently, our Milestone Ministries celebrate five moments in a child's faith journey: Baptism First Anniversary, First Bibles, Prayer, First-Time Campers, and Communion.

Baptism First Anniversary


